

## Aroma Gemstone Roller Bottle Tops

**Carnelian** - Carnelian can appear red, orange or amber in color. It can be transparent to nearly opaque.

**Tiger's Eye** – Tiger Eye can be brown, yellow or a mix of the two.

**Rose Quartz** - Rosy pink to very, very light pink in color. Not very transparent.

**Blue Lace Agate** – Agate is a banded form of microcrystalline quartz. The color patterns and banding make this gemstone unique and no two agates are alike. Has a bluish hue in color.

**Amethyst** – Colors can range from very light to very dark purple. Amethyst comes from many different mining sources, some of which produce distinct color styles. A deep purplish-blue color, deeply colored with reddish and bluish tints are all variants of Amethyst.

**Sodalite** – Sodalite is a blue gemstone and can be veined with white streaks or markings. It comes in all shades of blue from light blue to deep royal-blue, and from grayish-blue to violet.

**Green Aventurine** - Can be a dark to a light greenish color.

**Leopard Jasper** – Can be brown, yellow, or reddish in color, but may also be dark or mottled green, orange, and black. Jasper is almost always multicolored, with unique color patterns and habits. No two are alike!

**Red Aventurine** – Can be a reddish brown, orangish color or yellowish.

**Rainbow Fluorite** - Occurs in all colors, including colorless, white, purple, blue, red, pink, orange, yellow, brown, green, gray, and black. May also be multicolored and banded.

**Brecciated Jasper** - Jasper is one of the many gemstone varieties of quartz available today. The name 'jasper' is derived from the Greek word for 'spotted stone', referring to its typical multicolored, striped, spotted or flamed appearance. Jasper can form in virtually any color.



**Clear Quartz** - White, clear or opaque in color.
